The living things
 The non-living things
 The man-made things

**Living Things** - All plants, animals, birds and humans are living beings. They can also be referred to as natural things. These things are not made by humans.













**Non-living Things** - The things that are not alive are known as non-living things. Sun, air, water, rocks, soil, wood, honey, milk, gold, iron and many more are nature's gift to us and they are non-living things.

Anthills - Ever heard of Anthills? Tiny creatures ants and termites make these structures with mud. Some termite hills can be as high as 30 feet!
